What is the Sports Premium?

The Department for Education has confirmed today that the Primary PE and sport premium funding will continue for academic year 2022-23.

The funding is a ring-fenced grant for English primary schools to provide additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE, sport and physical activity. Allocations to schools are determined by a formula based on pupil numbers. £320 million will be delivered to schools in 2022-23 to give more children access to high quality PE lessons and sporting opportunities, supporting both their physical and mental wellbeing.

In addition, £11 million will also support the continuation of the School Games programme to give particularly passionate and talented young people the opportunity to participate in competitive sport.

The PE and sport premium and School Games programme support the government's commitment to ensuring children and young people have access to at least 60 minutes, or 20 minutes for children with a disability, of physical activity a day. Building on this commitment, £10 million is supporting schools to open up sport and swimming facilities. The Department for Education has already provided funding from phase one and two of this initiative to schools and is currently procuring a national delivery partner to allocate further funding and advice to schools over the next phase of the programme.

The Sports Premium funding in 2022-23 continues and it is anticipated we will receive **£19,110** at Pinehurst Primary School. There is no underspend to carry forward from the previous year.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision.

Department for Education's Purpose of funding:

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- · running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games

- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
- Membership to the Liverpool Sports School Partnership (LSSP) giving us access to range of CPD, enabling children to participate in a range of sporting competitions and events

How Pinehurst Primary School will be spending the Sports Funding 2022-23 and who will benefit:

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: **all children benefit** regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming and school visits are subsidised in order to support all families financially.

Swimming is part of the National Curriculum, before children leave our school it is expected that they are able to meet the objectives highlighted below. At Pinehurst Primary School, all children go swimming in KS2 (Y4-6) and continue through the Juniors with extra sessions in the Summer Term for Y6 pupils – these 'extra' sessions allow those who haven't managed to swim 25 m by Y6.
