## Teaching and Le earning



Along with English and maths, science remains one of the main core subjects in primary school. It can be one of the most exciting and practical subjects and, as a result, is a real joy for teachers and pupils.

Children love the chance to learn through being totally hands-on and finding things out for themselves — the perfect way to understand the world around them. A positive primary science experience is also key to encouraging future generations to not only study this at secondary school, but also potentially to follow it as a career.

The working scientifically component of the curriculum sets out the practical scientific methods, processes and skills that pupils should be taught to use through their learning of the conceptual content. Working in a scientific way should not, therefore, to be taught as a separate element of the curriculum but

must be embedded into the teaching of the conceptual content. Pupils are given opportunities to answer scientific questions using the five types of scientific enquiry: observing over time; pattern seeking; identifying, classifying and grouping; comparative and fair testing (controlled investigations); and researching using secondary sources

# **5 TIPS FOR AN ECO-FRIENDLY CHRISTMAS**



# 1. Turn off your Christmas lights when you're not in/overnight



## 2. Go green with your gift wrapping 🌌

- In the UK we use 108 million rolls of wrapping paper at Christmas - enough to wrap around the equator 9 times!

Can you challenge yourself to not buy any new wrapping paper this year?
If you've been getting the 'odd'(!) online delivery or two, can you reuse any of the paper packaging from these?

- Use old comics, newspapers, or sheet music.



## 3. Ditch the sellotape

- You can get plain brown tape which works well if you're using craft paper or packing paper as your wrapping of choice.

4. Use last year's cards as gift tags



5. Recycle well

- When it comes to recycling your Christmas, the most important thing to do is to check with your local authority what they will accept and what they won't - just head over to your local council's website and you should find the info you need.

- Wrapping paper with glitter on it, or paper that is metallic/plastic-y can't be recycled and has to go in your landfill bin.

- When it comes to your tree, if you have a real one without roots, again check with your local authority - many will collect them on specific days to mulch them.



We have recently noticed that a lot of our children are being collected early from school, before the end of the school day.

We understand that some children need to attend medical appointments at this time, but quite often we are not being shown any medical evidence to authorise these appointments.
