


This half-term the children at Pinehurst have been immersed into our History curriculum where all pupils Experience, Excel and Enjoy. Our History Curriculum has been carefully planned to ensure that children's learning is progressive and is built on previously taught knowledge. History at Pinehurst begins in the Early Years, where our children are encouraged to reflect on their personal childhood memories. In Key Stage 1, children's learning progresses to focus on events that have happened both within and beyond living memory. Later in Key Stage 2, the children are taught more explicit topics including Ancient Greece and World War 2.

At Pinehurst we are proud of our locality, and we recognise the rich history that surrounds us; we proudly celebrate topics including 'Football in Liverpool' and 'Music in Liverpool' as part of our History curriculum.

Throughout this school year all children will have the opportunity to participate in a range of events to deepen their understanding of the past.

Please ensure that you distance from other adults and families at drop off and pick up.

Alternate lunches of hot and cold options, children may bring a packed lunch if this is their preference.

Due to ventilation requirements, if your child is cold in school they should wear extra layers. This may include a vest or additional layer under their polo shirt, or a school or navy fleece over their sweatshirt. We will consider scarves and fingerless gloves as the term progresses and update you.

If your child has a COVID symptom of a cough, high temperature (above 37.8 degrees) or a loss of taste or smell they <u>must stay off school</u> and get tested for COVID19.
