Maths teaches logic and order. You can expect a mathematical equation to have a predictable outcome, and precise steps must be followed in order to attain that result. The discipline of mind that children develop in math class can carry over into everyday life. Maths can also provide a vehicle through which critical-thinking skills are put into practice and refined. An example of mathematical critical thinking is when the children are required to explain how they arrived at a solution to a complex problem or to describe the ideas behind the steps taken to solve a problem. At Pinehurst, we start developing these skills in the children as soon as they start our school.

Please encourage the children to continue to login to TTRockstars on a regular basis to help improve their times tables knowledge and recall.



Please be aware that you should only expect responses in school hours 9.00am — 4.00pm Monday to Friday.

Please also be aware that staff from your child's class may be working in school with Key Worker Bubbles so a response may not be immediate or may be from another class.

A suggested timetable that mirrors the school day has been provided for your child's class.

Some lessons such as Phonics, Music, Spanish will be in video format.
