Please bring a <u>named water bottle</u> to school each day.

Alternate lunches of hot and cold options, children may bring a packed lunch if this is their preference.

Due to ventilation requirements, if your child is cold in school they should <u>wear extra layers</u>. This may include a vest or additional layer under their polo shirt, or a school or navy fleece over their sweatshirt.

If your child has a <u>COVID symptom</u> of a cough, high temperature (above 37.8 degrees) or a loss of taste or smell they <u>must stay off school</u> and get tested for COVID19. The same applies to children <u>if a household member has</u> <u>these symptoms</u>. The whole household must self isolate and the children must stay off school.

Once the test results are in, <u>school must be informed IMMEDIATELY</u>. If it is during school hours please call the office 0151 263 1300, if it is outside school hours please call or text 07858 739336.

In the event of a school bubble having to isolate notification will be by text, tweet and letters will be published on our website. <u>Please ensure that you check your phone for such messages</u>.
