From the very beginning of school and throughout their time at Pinehurst, our children are encouraged to develop a positive attitude toward mathematics and are supported in doing so through opportunities across the curriculum. We strive to help our children to become mathematically fluent through the discovery of mathematical ideas in the Early Years. The use of daily math instruction and focused "basic skills" sessions aid mathematical fluency throughout KS1 and KS2.

In Pinehurst, we use an adapted version of the "Maths No Problem" scheme to help the teaching and learning of mathematics. Every day, we start our math lessons with an exploratory activity backed by concrete resources like place value counters, blocks, Numicon, or Base 10. We encourage the children to take the initiative and lead the conversation as they brainstorm solutions with their peers. The children "journal" their thoughts, illustrating various approaches and suggestions they might make. After that, the children will work with their teacher on some guided activities before doing an autonomous activity based on what they learned that day.

We have an exciting couple of months ahead at Pinehurst. We have already celebrated Maths Party Day in September, and we will be having a combined TT Rockstars and NSPCC Numbers Count day at the beginning of February. We will be encouraging the children in KS1 to dress as Robots, to celebrate Numbots, and our KS2 children to dress as Rockstars for the day, asking for a small donation for NSPCC.

We would like to encourage all children to continue working hard to complete their Numbots and TT Rockstars homework, and we have been thrilled with the number of children who have been doing so. We have lots of competition winners, and we're looking forward to celebrating some new winners this year!



Please be reminded Pinehurst will be closed to pupils on Wednesday next week.




Bug Busting
