What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £320 million in 2020-21 of Sport Premium a substantial amount to contribute to primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The Sports Premium funding in 2020-21 continues and it is anticipated we will receive £19,121 at Pinehurst Primary School.

A carry forward of £389.50 from 2019-210 makes a total of £19,510.50

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Department for Education's Purpose of funding:

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- · new or additional sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- · running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
- Membership to the Liverpool Sports School Partnership (LSSP) giving us access to range of CPD, enabling children to participate in a range of sporting competitions and events

How Pinehurst Primary School will be spending the Sports Funding 2020-21 and who will benefit:

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: **all children benefit** regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming

and school visits are subsidised in order to support all families financially.



Swimming is part of the National Curriculum, before children leave our school it is expected that they are able to meet the objectives highlighted below. At Pinehurst Primary School, all children go swimming in KS2 (Y4-6) and continue through the Juniors with extra sessions in the Summer Term for Y6 pupils – these 'extra' sessions allow those who haven't managed to swim 25 m by Y6.
