

Healing Together

This programme provides support for children and young people who are impacted by Domestic Abuse. The programme is designed to help children and young people learn about their feelings and how their body and brain can work together to help them feel safe and calm.

Participants will receive the tools, resources and coping strategies to feel comfortable in their own skin.

This 6 week, 1 hour a week programme is for children and young people aged 6-16 years old. Delivered on a 1:1 basis or as a group session at the individuals' school, by trained Youth Engagement staff from Merseyside Fire and Rescue Service.

The programme has been developed by Innovating Minds, and funded by the Merseyside Violence Reduction Partnership.
