Computing

The National Curriculum for computing that we deliver at Pinehurst aims to ensure that all pupils:

- * can understand and apply the fundamental principles and concepts of computer science, including abstraction, logic, algorithms and data representation.
- * can analyse problems in computational terms, and have repeated practical experience of writing computer programs in order to solve such problems.
 - * can evaluate and apply information technology, including new or unfamiliar technologies, analytically to solve problems.
- * are responsible, competent, confident and creative users of information and communication technology.

E-Safety

As Christmas is getting closer, children and young people all over the country will be writing lists to Santa or giving hints about what they would like under the tree. Technology is now a very popular item on many children's lists with tablets, smartphones, game consoles and smartwatches likely to be asked for this year. Whilst we want children to enjoy their presents, it is also important that parents look at ways to ensure that their children use these devices safely. This includes setting parental controls and understanding that video games have PEGI ratings similar to the classification for films.

Other things that you may want to consider is managing screen time so that you can monitor the amount of time being spent on each device. This is useful for meal times or during the school holidays.

Finally, once the tinsel has come down and we welcome the New Year, make sure that you talk to your children about online safety.
