 $\hfill\square$  critique, evaluate and test their ideas and products and the work of others



Founded in 1998 and held every year around World Refugee Day on the 20<sup>th</sup> June, Refugee Week is also a growing global movement.



Healing means recovering from a painful experience or situation, so that we can continue to live. No-one understands this better than those who have lost their homes and had to build new lives from scratch. We have much to learn from refugees about holding onto hope when going on seems impossible – as well as about how art, creativity and community can help us to heal. Those going through the asylum system also know that healing is an ongoing process, made harder by poverty, housing difficulties and the threat of being detained or deported.
