If your child isn't well enough to attend school then you must call EVERY DAY to provide a reason. We must know why children are not present on a daily basis as part of our safeguarding duty.

If your child is persistently absent or has a history of persistent absenteeism medical evidence will be requested to confirm the reason for their absence.

Gates open at 8.40am and close at 8.55am when the register is taken and learning starts.

Your child's punctuality is critical to their success.

If they are late to school they miss out on the start of the first lesson of the day.

On time is before 5 to 9, 8.55am.



From the 1st September 2013, the new law does not give entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday during term time.

Parents can be fined by the Local Authority for taking their child on holiday during term time without consent from the school. A fixed Penalty Notice will then be issued to you in accordance with section 444 of the Education Act 1996. The current rates payable by parents are £60 where the rate is paid within 21 days and £120 where the amount is paid with 28 days. This charge is per parent/carer per child. If the fixed penalty notice remains unpaid this could lead to prosecution in the Magistrates Court.

Following some lenience after COVID please note that <u>all</u> term time holidays will be <u>unauthorised</u> in 2022-23 and fines will be issued.

- We recognise the impact of our own behaviours and will role model good attendance for children and young people. Within our own agencies and organisations, we will address attendance concerns and strive to improve staff attendance.
- We will acknowledge and champion outstanding and improved attendance.
- We will look to identify practice within our agencies which encourages good school attendance with the families we work with.
